The Master of Relational and Family Therapy degree is a two year (24 months) full-time immersive course based program, that will have you job-ready at graduation.

This degree will be a recognized education, training, and clinical experience program with the CRPO and and is provisionally accredited by CACFT.

MRFT students will accumulate up to 450 Direct Client Contact hours and over 100 hours of Clinical Supervision at Maplewoods, our innovative, on-site training facility.

MRFT students will be registered with the CRPO as a Registered Psychotherapist (Qualifying) in their final semester of the program.

- honours (4-year) baccalaureate degree, with a minimum 75% average in the last two years of study
- minimum 70% average in a social science research methods course
- not currently a regulated health professional practicing psychotherapy or a related field
- letter of interest
- two academic and one professional reference
- transcripts
