PROGRAM

The fully accredited professional degree program is a six-semester program, delivered over 32 months (with fall and winter term registration and scheduled academic breaks in the summer term). It attracts students from a variety of academic disciplines. The MLA course-based master's degree provides students the option of pursuing a final design or thesis project. The MLA degree meets the educational requirements for entry into professional associations of Landscape Architects across Canada and internationally.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Acceptance to the MLA program is based on previous academic performance, references, evidence of creativity (portfolio), and on background information that you provide through the Statement of Interest, Resumé, and the Supplemental Document - MLA Background Questionnaire.
- Applicants holding a minimum "B-" standing in the last four semesters of full-time study of an undergraduate four-year (honours) university degree in any degree program will be considered for admission.
