Start early!

Read the instructions!



The Message

- Exude enthusiasm and excitement
- Demonstrate thorough knowledge and deep understanding of your field
 - Provide context for your research
 - Highlight main research question(s)
 - Describe significance/impact
- Write for lay audience



The Details

- Highlight and elaborate your significant contributions
 - Awards
 - Publications/presentations
- Showcase your personal strengths and commitments
 - Volunteer, service, extracurricular



The Shout Out!

- Don't underestimate the importance of picking solid referees
 - Useful resource: Adam Chapnick, How to ask for a reference letter, University Affairs

- You have an A average...what else?
- Help your referee help you provide them with information that will help them write a strong reference

What is OGS?

- Ontario Graduate Scholarship (OGS)
- Funded by Ontario and U of Guelph
- Encourage excellence in Master's and Doctoral studies
- \$5,000/semester for 3 semesters
- Max. 2 years for Master's, 4 years for Doctoral
- How many OGS at U of G in 2023-24?
 - Not yet confirmed by the MTCU
 - Last Year Domestic = 138
 - Last Year International = 4



Where Do I Apply?

- Current U of G students
 - Continuing elsewhere: apply to other institution
 - Continuing at Guelph: apply to Guelph
- Future U of G students
 - Apply to Guelph



Where & How Do I Apply?

- Google "Guelph OGS"
 - eligibility, due dates, application forms available as of November 1
- Guelph Due Date: January 31, 2024
 - complete application package due to your Department
- If applying for OGS at other universities, visit their websites
 - due dates and processes vary, so check now!



Eligibility Criteria

- Full-time in an eligible graduate program
- Master's by December 31, 0-12 months of full-time study
- Doctoral by December 31, 0-36 months of full-time study (transfers counted from start of doctoral program)
- Minimum first-class average (A-) in **each** of your last 2 years of study
- Cannot be held concurrently with:
 - CIHR, NSERC, or SSHRC funding
 - QEII-GSST (OGS with a Science & Technology component)



Selection Criteria

- Academic Excellence 40%
- Research Proposal 30%
- Letters of Reference 30%



What is in an OGS application?

- •Research Proposal
- •List of scholarships/awards
- List of publications/presentations
- •Other academic achievements
- •2 Academic Assessment Forms emailed directly to your department
- •A complete application for admission to a graduate program at Guelph ask your department about graduate program requirements early!

The Lingo

- SSHRC = Social Sciences & Humanities Research Council
- NSERC = Natural Science & Engineering Research Council of Canada
- CIHR = Canadian Institutes of Health Research
- CGS-D = Joseph Armand Bombardier Canada Graduate Scholarship -Doctoral
 - \$35,000/year for 3 years
 - Harmonized eligibility criteria for SSHRC, NSERC, CIHR
- Agency Specific Awards:
 - NSERC PGS-D \$21,000/year for 3 years
 - Same eligibility criteria as the CGS-D, different locations of tenure
 - SSHRC Doctoral Fellowship
 - \$20,000/year for 1, 2, 3 or 4 years
 - Different eligibility criteria from the CGS-D



Fact Finding

- Google "Guelph SSHRC Doctoral" or "Guelph NSERC" Doctoral" or "Guelph CIHR Doctoral"
 - for Guelph's internal deadlines
 - link to SSHRC, NSERC, or CIHR websites for eligibility, application instructions, and subject matter eligibility



• Internal application deadline: September 28, 2023

Eligibility Criteria

- CGS-D: <36 months of doctoral studies as of Dec 31, 2023
- SSHRC Fellowship: < 48 months of doctoral studies as of Dec 31, 2023
- Citizen/permanent resident of Canada;
- First PhD (or equivalent);
- Have not already received a doctoral tri-council scholarship or fellowship
- You may apply for a master's level award or a doctoral level award in a given year, not both



How/Where to Apply?

- All applications must be submitted through the appropriate online application portal for each agency
- Refer to the CGS-D directions "<u>Where should I submit my</u> <u>application</u>"
 - If applying through an institution, input the institution name in your online application
 - Your application will be routed electronically to the institution selected when you submit

- UNIVERSITY &GUELPH
- The internal deadline to apply for the CGS-D if you are applying through the University of Guelph is:
 - Due date: September 28, 2023

Subject Matter Eligibility

- Google:
 - "subject matter eligibility SSHRC (or NSERC or CIHR)"
 - "selecting appropriate federal agency"
- You may only apply to one agency each year
- Apply to the agency that is the best fit for your research



 Justify submission to SSHRC if in Psychology or healthrelated field – discuss with your Graduate Coordinator or Advisor if you are unsure

Evaluation Criteria

50% Research Ability & Potential:

- research proposal
- -training, experience, contributions
- -judgment & critical thinking, responsible & ethical conduct
- -enthusiasm & originality, clear communication

50% Relevant Experience/Achievements (academia +):

- -scholarships & awards
- -academic record
- professional/academic/extracurricular activities & collaborations



Warning: Challenges Ahead

- Order all transcripts
 - -By September 20 for free Guelph transcripts
- Ask 2 professors to complete Letters of Appraisal (online)
 - The application portals will block your submission until your referees have submitted their assessments
- Put together your research proposal
- Submit your entire application package before the due date of Sept 28!



What's Next?

- First, the departments review and rank all applications
- Then applications are reviewed by a University-wide awards committee
 - The committee selects the strongest applications to forward to the national competition for consideration
 - SSHRC 27
 - NSERC 63
 - CIHR 4

- Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR)
 - Frederick Banting and Charles Best Canada Graduate
 Scholarship Masters (CGS-M)
- Natural Sciences & Engineering Research Council (NSERC)
 - Alexander Graham Bell CGS-M
- Social Sciences & Humanities Research Council (SSHRC)
 - Joseph-Armand Bombardier CGS-M



Value

- \$17,500/year for one year
 - At Guelph, CGS-M holders also receive a \$5,000/year top-up
- Non-renewable
- Life-time maximum of 1 CGS-M award
- Submit a maximum of one application a year
- Award is paid out in 3 equal instalments, over 3 semesters
 - Applied to your student account each semester

- NSERC hosts the CGS-M competition for all three agencies



Subject Matter

- Applicants must categorize proposed field of research:
 - Health (CIHR)
 - Natural Sciences and Engineering (NSERC)
 - Social Sciences and Humanities (SSHRC)
- Ensure submission to the correct agency
 - -Google "selecting federal granting agency"
- Allocation:



Eligibility Criteria

- Canadian citizen or permanent resident or protected person
- Full-time in an eligible Master's program
- Completed 0-12 months of full-time study or equivalent of:
 - Master's program
 - Direct-admit doctoral program (never registered in a Master's)
 - a master's program that was or will be fast-tracked to a doctoral program, and you are requesting funding for the first 12 months of this doctoral program
- Not previously held a CGS-M
- A first-class average (80%+ Guelph equivalent), as determined by the university, in each of the last two years of study (full-time equivalent)

How Do I Apply?

- On-line using the Research Portal
 - read the instructions!
 - 1 page research proposal, 1 page for references
 - Current up to date transcripts for all post-secondary studies including F22 registration, transfer credits, and exchanges
- Select up to three universities
 - where you are currently registered
 - where you intend to register
- Selection process & post-award administration carried out by universities
 - A CGS-M award may only be held at the offering institution



Selection Criteria

- Academic Excellence 50%
 - past academic results, transcripts, awards and distinctions, the referee assessments.
- Research Potential 30%
 - research history, interest in discovery, proposed research, potential contribution in the field, any anticipated outcomes, referee assessments.
- Personal Characteristics & Interpersonal Skills 20%
 - past professional and relevant extracurricular interactions, collaborations, referee assessments.



Important Dates

- Dec 1, 2023 Application Due Online (8 p.m. EST)
 Hard deadline
- April 1, 2023 Earliest results available online
 21 days later Applicant must respond to offer(s)

 - By November 20 for free Guelph transcripts
- Register to get your CIHR pin early
- Start your CGS-M Canadian Common CV (CCV) early
- Ask 2 professors to complete Letters of Appraisal
- Research proposal
- Submit your entire application package before the due date!



Michael Smith Foreign Studies Supplements (MSFSS)

- Available to CGS award holders
 - NSERC PGS-D and SSHRC Fellowships not eligible
- Fosters research abroad
- Up to \$6,000 to offset the cost of travel abroad for 2-6 months
- Two competitions per year
