Program

Students will spend semesters 2 and 3 in the same University and semesters 1 and 4 in two different Universities. On completion, successful students will receive both an international diploma supplement, which conforms to the European standards of the Bologna process, and a Masters Degree Certificate from each of the three universities that they attend.

The Master's program is open to students who: have successfully completed an undergraduate degree in the field of Arts, Languages or Social Sciences, particularly a Modern Languages Degree (e.g. language, literature, thought and cultural studies programs of a high, specialized level relating to one or more of the following: Britain, France, Italy, Portugal, Spain, Germany – or Europe as a whole); have an attested level of First Class or 2:1 Bachelor of Arts Honours Degree (or equivalent); are among the top 5-10 students of their year; possess a near-native, degree-level command of TWO of the following languages: English, French, Italian, Portuguese, Polish, German and Spanish – together with a basic knowledge of, or a willingness to acquire, a third language.
