Mitacs funding opportunities

Mitacs Accelerate Fellowship

Master's students can complete an 18-month project (minimum \$30,000 stipend). PhD students can complete a three-year project (minimum \$72,000 stipend). The Fellowship also offers national professional development training that helps interns gain in-demand career skills and ensure the success of their projects.

Mitacs Elevate Postdoctoral Fellowship

Mitacs is now accepting applications for two-year postdoctoral funding (\$60,000 annual award plus \$7,500 per year non-cash value in training).
